 - What capital accessibility improvements are still planned to move forward?
- Aside from potential service planning changes, will the constraints on Operating Budget impact any accessibility programs?



Capital Projects Related to Accessibility Proposed to Pause for Reconsideration

Project	Proposal	Total Funds Reallocated
Winchester CR Rebuild	Complete Design. Pause Construction.	\$42.8M
South Attleboro CR Rebuild	Advance Design. Pause Construction.	\$41.6M
Auburdale/Newtonville, West Newton Rebuild	Complete Design. Pause Construction	\$15.1M
Future Elevator Designs	Scale back to focus on the highest priority locations	\$17M
Wayfinding	Focus on safety-critical work	\$45M
Misc. Accessibility Upgrades	Scale back to focus on highest priority efforts	\$4.5M

- Quincy Adams—1 new unit, 3 replacements


Designs (37 units)

- Central—2 new units, I replacement
- Sullivan--1 new unit, 2 replacements
- Davis--3 new units, 2 replacements
- Chinatown--2 new units, 2 replacements and lobby rebuilds
- North Station--2 new units
- State Street--2 new units, 2 replacements
- Mass Ave: 1 new unit, 1 replacement
- Broadway: 2 new units, 2 replacements
- Jackson Square: 1 new unit, 1 replacement
- Arlington: 3 new units
- Wellington: 3 new units, 2 replacement units

Downtown Crossing Elevators--Design

The Downtown Crossing Phase II Project Scope includes 3 new elevators:

- Summer Street Concourse (Macy's Elevator)
 New elevator between Orange Line
 Northbound and Red Line Southbound
- Winter Street Concourse at Park Street (Elevator 808) – An enlarged and relocated new Elevator 808 that connects Red Line Northbound and Orange Line Southbound at Downtown Crossing via Winter Street Concourse
- Washington Street Elevator (Winter Street Building) – New replacement elevator that connects Washington Street, Orange Line Southbound, and Red Line Southbound

Bus Stop Upgrades

- Critical & High Priority Stops
 - 50+ have been reconstructed/under construction
 - 180+ under design




Stop 3819: Federal St @ Front St, Weymouth



- Automated door openers
- Path of travel upgrades
- Digital screens elevator outages



Impact on Accessibility Programs Funded by Operating Budget

- Elevator Maintenance Program
 - No proposed change hours to, staffing, performance expectations, or scope of service
- Transit Ambassadors at Stations
 - Scale back portion of recent staffing increase. Coverage will remain higher than FY21
- Internal Access Monitoring Program
 - No proposed change to scope of program. Monitoring will remain mostly on hold until pandemic subsides
