



Roslindale Robert Street Bridge Replacement Project

Robert Street Road Closure, June 4-7

The Robert Street Bridge carries the Needham Line over Robert Street near Roslindale Village Station. The steel bridge, which was built in 1898 and last rehabilitated in 1985, is nearing the end of its useful life and will be completely replaced to meet the MBTA's reliability and modernization needs.

The MBTA's contractor for the Robert Street bridge replacement will close Robert Street under the Commuter Rail bridge **from 8:00 PM on Friday, June 4 to 4:00 AM on Monday, June 7**. The closure is necessary to allow the contractor to safely remove the existing bridge and move the new superstructure into place.

During the closure through travelers should use the following detours:

- **Pedestrians and bicyclists:** use (1) Belgrade Avenue to the Fallon Field Walkway Tunnel and South Fairview Street to reach Robert Street, or (2) the walkway from the Roslindale Station drop off at Belgrade Avenue to South Conway Street to reach Robert Street.

- **Vehicles:** use Belgrade Avenue, West Roxbury Parkway, and South Street.

A **detour map** is posted on the website. Detour signs will be in place to indicate the routes. Local access on Robert Street on either side of the Commuter Rail bridge will be maintained.

Buses will replace train service on the **Needham Commuter Rail Line** between Forest Hills and Needham Heights after 7:30 PM on Friday, June 4. There is currently no weekend commuter rail service on the Needham Line.
