




Week in Review and Lookahead

B Branch Station Consolidation



B Branch Station Consolidation Project: Consolidate four (4) existing Green Line stations on the B Branch along Commonwealth Avenue adjacent to Boston University, into two (2), fully accessible, brand new stations (Babcock & Amory).

- ✓ **Last Week** | Workers installed roofing, electrical work, signs and sign panels, and site finishes at Babcock Street and Amory Street Station
- **Lookahead** | Continue with roofing installation, concrete sealing and anti-graffiti treatment, electrical work and installation of sign and screen frames, and mesh and sign panels



7 Weeks Early Access* Weeknights 9:00pm - 5:00am




7 Weekends* Saturday 12:00am - Monday 5:00am

D Branch Track and Signal Replacement Project: Upgrade 25,000 feet of track and reconstruct 7 miles of signal system (Beaconsfield to Riverside).

- ✓ Last Week | Crews continued signal installation and testing continued between Reservoir and Riverside, as well as a general cleanup along the work area
- Lookahead | Continuing cleanup along the work area. Crews will also continue signal installation and testing from Reservoir to Riverside

Lechmere Viaduct Rehabilitation Project



Percentages represent the value of the installed work

Lechmere Viaduct Rehabilitation Project: Strengthen and preserve the 110-year-old viaduct for heavier loads and increased train frequency.

- ✓ Last Week | Continued concrete repairs, crack injection, carbon fiber wrap of concrete arches, and electrical and track punch list
- **Lookahead** | Continue crack injection, concrete repairs, carbon fiber wrap of concrete arches, removal of temporary access walkways. Track punchlist items and removal of shielding beneath spans. Complete punch list of signals and traction power items
