
# Elevator Program (Phase II) Overview

### Overview:

- The need for elevator replacements and renovations for 9 stations throughout the area to make the stations fully accessible
- Project awarded to AECOM for Mass Ave and Jackson Square
  - Design Start: Fall 2020
  - Design Contract Value: \$4.7 million
  - Status: 30% Design Complete, progressing to 75%


### **Objectives:**

- Improve station accessibility with more reliable elevator service, as well as improvements to pedestrian circulation, station lighting and wayfinding
- · Improved safety, reliability, and customer experience




### **Exterior Conditions**

# Proposed Improvements: Circulation



- New elevator across the fare line for redundancy
- Existing elevator will be modernized according to MBTA 2019 guidelines
- Improvements to emergency exit stairs at North and South ends
- Exterior sidewalk and bus berth upgrades



## Proposed Improvements: Materials, Experience

- Electrical upgrades throughout station
- Repairs to roofing leaks
- Repairs to glazing and flooring materials
- Upgrades to public restroom accessories
- Select wayfinding signage and lighting upgrades


