


Week in Review and Lookahead Friday, July 1, 2022

- Lookahead | At Oak Grove crews will continue interior demolition of existing mechanical and electrical components. Programming and testing will continue at Sullivan Square Station



- ✓ This Week | Crews installed trackwork and new track switches which will allow for improved movement of trains between tracks in the yard. Electricians installed power, communication, and signal wiring
- Lookahead | Crews will continue the installation of new track and associated electrical work

Wellington Maintenance Facility: Modernize the Vehicle Maintenance Facility to improve vehicle maintenance; reducing customer wait times, provide cleaner cars, and deliver safer operations.

- ✓ This Week | Crews continued installing an overhead steel walkway platform system and removed sections of the old concrete floor to allow for the replacement of tracks inside the facility. Electricians installed new wiring for lighting and fire alarm systems
- **Lookahead** New flooring will be installed in the electronics rooms in the facility. Crews will continue to install and paint the steel catwalk frame which will provide access to the top of the trains for maintenance
