Jackson Square

Partnership between City of Boston and MBTA

- Originated in Go Boston 2030
- Serves multiple MBTA Bus Network Redesign High Frequency Routes
- 45% of Sept '22 MBTA trips are bus trips
- Boston Vision Zero High Crash Network
- Builds on previous Columbus Ave (Phase 1) Bus Lane Project
- Project helps address multiple MBTA and City goals










Challenges & Opportunities

users on buses




- Bus trips between Nubian Station and Ruggles Station are slow and unreliable due to variable traffic conditions
- Tremont and Ruggles Streets, in particular, have significant levels of delay
- Columbus Ave Phase 1 Saved 4-8 minutes during peak hour trips

.5 Miles takes 10 Minutes

A peak-period transit trip from Nubian Station to Ruggles is time consuming and much of the congestion occurs on Tremont Street




Crash History - Since 1-1-2019

Existing Street Design

- Currently prioritizes cars over transit, biking, and walking
- High speeds loud and uncomfortable
- High speeds and unsafe conditions for pedestrians and cyclists traveling <u>along</u> and <u>across</u> the corridor
- Existing curbside regulations aren't responsive to diverse uses
- Lacking green infrastructure and public realm features







Pedestrian and Bicycle Access



- High vehicle pedestrian/cyclist conflicts along Southwest Corridor; unsafe to cross
- Non-compliant ramps are in poor condition
- Single bicycle and pedestrian ramps and crossings along Southwest Corridor




Bus Priority Elements

Ensure that bus service is reliable and consistent for all trips - even during rush hour --**Bus routes operating in the project area serve nearly 50,000 riders per day (Sept '22)**

Our tool kit includes:

- Bus Lanes
- "Queue Jump" Lanes
- Street Directionality
- Transit Signal Priority



- Separate, bicycle and pedestrian crossings along Southwest Corridor
- Wider bicycle crossings that connect to Southwest Corridor bicycle facility
- Clear wayfinding at plazas, especially Roxbury Crossing
- Increase Bluebike Parking & Stations



Pedestrian Connectivity





Ensure safe and accessible connections along and across the corridor

- Curb ramp and crosswalk upgrades; updated pedestrian traffic signals
- Safe bicycle pedestrian infrastructure along and across the Southwest Corridor
- Mid-block crossings and other pedestrian connectivity



Green Infrastructure & Public Realm

- Plantings and landscaping
- Incorporate natural and stormwater run-off features into the project
- Benches, Public Art,
 Placemaking, and Street
 Furniture
- Close coordination with area stakeholders – seeking your feedback!












Curb Access




