
## Who Can Initiate a Change Order?

- The MBTA
  - MBTA Request
  - Designer Recommendation
  - Builder Inspector or Fire Department Request
  - Other Stakeholders
- The Contractor

## Typical Causes of a Change Order

- Design Plans or Specification Changes (DCR)
- Differing Site Conditions (DSC)
- Errors/Omissions (E&O)
- Schedule Milestone Changes
- 3rd Party Interference or Constraints/Utility Companies
- Acceleration/Surges/Diversions
- Force Majeure/Weather/Acts of God
- Change in Laws or Regulations

- •Labor Rate Sheet

#### Equipment

- Equipment Hours with Rates and Subcontract Costs
- •Owned Equipment Priced Using Published Blue Book Operating Rates [Fuel is Included]
- •Cost of Rental Equipment Supported with Invoices [Fuel is Additional]

#### Materials

- •Materials with Quantities and Unit Prices
- Documentation of Materials [Paid Invoices; Submitted Invoices; Vendor Quotes; Invoices From Previous Jobs; Published Catalog Prices]

#### Profit

#### Rigorous Review of Contractor's Costs

- •PM Develops an ICE [Independent Cost Estimate]
- •ICE Developed Prior to Review of Contractor's Costs
- Change Order Analyst Performs a Detailed Review of the Cost Proposal and Develops a Strainer
- •ICE and Strainer are Used by the PM to Negotiate
- •The Change Order Analyst, and, if necessary, The Director of Change Order Management, Assist in the Negotiation

## Recent Improvements and Change Order Mitigation

- Improvements
  - Small Dollar Change Order Process [< \$25K]</li>
  - PCO Process/Identifying the Cause
  - Sworn Statement of Account
- Mitigation
  - Negotiate a Complex Scope of Design Services [PS Negotiation Matrix]
  - Improved Technical Review of Design Development Submittals
  - Discipline Related to Owner Requested Changes
  - ACEC Training Quality Management
