Corrective Action Plan (CAP)

### **BACKGROUND**

**Overview:** The FTA issued Special Directive 22-4 that required the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) to address ongoing safety concerns at MBTA and interim findings uncovered during FTA's Safety Management Inspection (SMI) that was initiated in April 2022.

This Special Directive mandated that MBTA take nine required actions in three distinct categories related to maintenance of way (MOW). These required actions are to address deficiencies in personal protective equipment (PPE) and right of way (ROW) safety; to correct defective track conditions; and to address management practices that negatively impact track repair.

### **PURPOSE**

This Corrective Action Plan has been developed to address **Special Directive 22-4 Category 1: Personnel Safety** and its Required Action **FTA-TRA-22-001** 

### FTA Finding

### **Personnel Safety**

MBTA has not established consistent PPE requirements for ROW access.

### FTA Required Action

• **FTA-TRA-22-001:** MBTA must establish consistent PPE requirements for ROW personnel access. Personnel is inclusive of all employees, contractors, oversight, or other individuals who access the rail system and facilities.

### **ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

#### Analysis

The MBTA has identified the governing documents that specify Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) requirements
for all personnel accessing the ROW. ROW Commuter Rail Operating rules are regulated by the FRA and will be
included in the consistent PPE requirements policy.

#### Recommendations

MBTA will review all of the agency's policies related to PPE for ROW access and establish one agency-wide policy
that will be incorporated into the MBTA Safety Plan and all relevant MBTA departments' safety plans. The MBTA will
communicate the updated policy to all employees and others who access the ROW and will update the ROW access
training program to include the new consistent PPE policy.



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### **ACTION PLAN**

**Description:** The MBTA will establish a Safety Management Working Group (SMWG) made up of representatives from stakeholder departments that will review all existing MBTA PPE policies and establish one agency-wide policy for ROW access. The MBTA will:

- Review all requirements for PPE to access the ROW for various work activities
- Develop a consistent minimum PPE requirement for accessing the ROW and assess any conflicts with department specific additions to meet specific job or task requirements
- Promulgate the minimum PPE requirements for accessing the ROW
- Incorporate proper use of the required PPE in ROW access training programs
- Develop a compliance framework for verifying adherence to the minimum PPE requirements

#### Verification

- The verification strategy for ensuring completion of the required work will be through establishing the existence of the following:
- Written policy for minimum PPE requirements for accessing the ROW.
- Collection of training records for personnel, participant's name, badge #, department and company name (for contractors and visitors) will be recorded and retained.
- Safety rules compliance program across the MBTA.

### **BUDGET/COST ESTIMATE**

**Overview:** Procurement of training materials and PPE materials for employees to meet the new standards. The budget values below are estimates that will require further refinement as the work associated with this CAP is developed and implemented. Estimates include 30% contingency.
