Improvements, set to begin in 2024, include the installation of four new accessible elevators, raised station platforms, accessible restrooms, improved wayfinding, lighting, and added safety & security features.





Proposed Relocation of Utilities


The utilities being relocated are currently positioned in four areas that will be excavated for new elevators and stairs that will be constructed at each entrance of Symphony Station.







Traffic Management During Construction



Huntington Ave Eastbound Off-Ramp **Temporarily Closed**

In order to access the Huntington Ave. eastbound off-ramp, take a right onto Ruggles St. followed by a left onto Tremont St. and then a left on Massachusetts Ave. to get back onto Huntington Ave.




Huntington Ave Westbound Off-Ramp Temporarily Closed

In order to access the Huntington Ave. westbound off-ramp, travel down West Newton St. and take a right down Massachusetts Route 28/ Columbus Ave. followed by another right on to Massachusetts Ave. to return to Huntington Ave.







In order to access Huntington Ave. traveling eastbound, vehicles must take a right on Massachusetts Ave. followed by a left onto St Botolph St. and another left on Cumberland St. to get back on Huntington Ave.





To access the Huntington Ave. westbound on-ramp, travel down Massachusetts Ave. and take a right onto St. Botolph St. followed by another right on Gainsborough St.

Huntington Ave Underpass Temporarily Closed

If access is prohibited in the Huntington Ave. underpass, vehicles may use the east and west bound ramps in order to continue down Huntington Ave.

Weekday Detours

Set up after morning rush hour and taken down before afternoon rush hour.

Parking Bans

Temporary parking bans may be put into place, depending on work areas.

Detours and lane closures will vary during construction. Traffic management plan is still in development and detours may change.
