Key Revisions for Approval by September 1, 2023

2023 Transit Safety Plan Update Overview

- Per 49 CFR § 673.11 (a)(5) and 220 CMR 151.03, MBTA must review its Transit Safety Plan annually and, if updates are required, submit the Plan to DPU for approval on or before September 1.
- Factors influencing the annual plan update may include:
 - Internal and external audit findings
 - Investigation results
 - Trends in safety data
 - Organizational changes
 - Reassignment of functional responsibilities
 - Legal and regulatory changes
- Distinct from 49 CFR Part 270-based Commuter Rail System Safety Program Plan, which addresses 20 key policy and program requirements in FRA regulations

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- Prior to submittal to DPU, Plan review process includes:
 - Review and approval by Joint Labor-Management Safety Committee
 - Safety Management Review Committee review
 - Accountable Executive (MBTA General Manager) review and signature
 - Board of Directors SHE Subcommittee review
 - Board of Directors review and approval
 - Certification by Department of Public Utilities



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- Factors informing the 2023 update include:
 - FTA SMI Corrective Action Plan Requirements
 - Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Requirements



Preface 1, Safety Policy Statement

Updated and signed in consultation with GM Eng.

• Preface 2, MBTA SMS Implementation

 Updates to reflect current status of SMS Implementation and key changes since December 2022 revision.

Section 1.3, Federal, State, and Local Authority

- Updated to include description of FTA SMI and status of SMI response.
- Updated to discuss DPU authority to perform risk-based inspection activities of MBTA facilities and assets, including requirements for MBTA data sharing to support this process.

Section 1.4, Plan Review, Revision, and Approval

 Updated graphics and description to reflect requirements for Joint Labor-Management Safety Committee and Board Safety, Health, and Environmental Subcommittee review of the draft Transit Safety Plan.

Section 2, SMS Supporting Elements

 Section title revised to better reflect section content, which includes both plan/policy references and an overview of MBTA's safety culture commitments.

• Section 4.2, Safety Management Committee Structure

 Expanded description of safety committee structure and objectives, including discussion of strategic/tactical purpose for meetings at different levels and the role of employee participation.

Section 3.1, MBTA Safety Performance Targets

 Targets updated for 2023, based on 2% reduction in three-year rolling average of performance from 2020-2022.

• Section 5, Safety Risk Management

- Updated triggers for application of formal risk management, to include safety issues escalated from the Employee Safety Reporting Program and the Local Safety Committee meeting process.
- "Reactive" and "Proactive" probability/likelihood levels renamed to "Events" (for reactive issues) and "Conditions" (for proactive analysis).
- Updated description of mitigation monitoring process, including examples of compliance- and performance-based monitoring activities.

Section 6.3, Data Analysis

 Expanded description of responsibilities and management structure for collection, storage, reconciliation, and reporting of safety data.

• Section 8.1, Personnel Directly Responsible for Safety Oversight

Updated with description of Deputy Chief Safety Officer role.

- Appendix H added to list existing Safety Department Standard Operating Procedures.
