



South Coast Rail - Phase I





Background

The South Coast Rail Program is one of the largest rail expansions in recent Massachusetts history.

With \$1.1 billion in Commonwealth funding, South Coast Rail will expand the MBTA commuter rail service from Boston to the cities of Taunton, Fall River, New Bedford, and the Southeastern region.

Phase-1 includes 36 miles of right of way work including; new track, installation of modern signals and communication systems, traffic signal, crosswalks, road work at station entry and the following:

Stations

- Middleborough
- East Taunton
- New Bedford
- Church Street
- Freetown
- Fall River Depot

Layover Facilities

- Wamsutta Layover, New Bedford, MA
- · Weaver's Cove Layover, Fall River, MA

Fall River Secondary Line

- 12.1 miles of track
- 8 bridges
- 10 grade crossings
- 10 culverts

Middleborough/New Bedford Main Line

- 24.1 miles of track
- 18-grade crossings
- 11 culverts

Rolling Stock

- 16 Hyundai Rotem Bi Level Coaches
- Overhaul of two existing Locomotives
- Equip MCRR locomotives with PTC
- Upgrade freight yard tracks and sidings



Safety of Project

- Every right-of-way (ROW) grade crossing will include active warning system including crossing gates, bells and lights
- Grade Crossing safety equipment will be activated when MBTA and Keolis begin testing trains on the ROW
- The Safety-First program has been created to alert every community to the startup and testing of SCR vehicles
 - Follow-up email to targeted stakeholders:
 - Schools, municipalities, sportsmen, ATV users, pedestrians, dog walkers and more
 - Requests for presentations are coming in
 - Program includes presentations, theme brochures, handouts and videos
 - Monthly theme messaging started in April
- SCR team meets with regional Fire/Life/Safety agencies
 - Regional emergency services drills
 - July 27 in Freetown for the Freetown and mutual aid departments along the Fall River Secondary.
 - November 19 in New Bedford for the New Bedford Mainline and Middleborough Secondary departments.

South Coast Rail Construction Accomplishments

Early Action Contracts

- 46 Culverts
- 4 Bridges
- Demolition of Structures
- Long Lead Material Procurement

Construction Contracts

- Fall River Secondary
- Middleborough Secondary/New Bedford Mainline
- New Bedford Pedestrian Bridge
- Off-Site Traffic Mitigation
- Freight Yard Upgrades

Work Complete as of September 15, 2023

- 36 miles of track installed
- 18 Bridges
- 25 Grade Crossings
- 21 additional Culverts
- 2 Stations
- 2 Layover Facilities
- 2 Crew houses
- 50+ Utility Agreements



Current Status

- The Fall River Line construction contract is substantially complete; with only final punch list items left to complete.
- The Middleborough/New Bedford Line contract is **85% complete**. Final track, civil and station work are expected to be substantially completed by the end of 2023. ATC/PTC Systems Testing and Commissioning on the Middleborough, New Bedford and Fall River Lines will continue through the spring; followed by Operational Qualification (Field) Training and FRA Simulated Service Demonstration.
- The Off-Site Traffic Mitigation project is **80% complete**. The contractor is closing out East Taunton's construction in October with remaining work at Fall River, New Bedford and Middleborough complete by end of the year.

Next Steps

- East Taunton
 - Station and Elevator Completion
- Automatic Train Control (ATC) testing:
 - Nearly 2,000 required tests
- Positive Train Control (PTC):
 - Software design and verification (lab tests)
- Positive Train Control (PTC):
 - Months of locomotive field testing along all three lines of the South Coast Rail Territory

- Fire/Life Safety Training
- Safety Certification of System
 - Over 200 Safety Critical Elements
 - Bridges, Culverts, Grade Crossings, Walls
 - Track, Stations, Layovers, ATC/PTC Systems, etc.
- Operational Qualification Field testing:
 - Locomotive Crews
 - Commissioning Equipment for Service
- FRA Simulated Service Demonstration
- System Ready for Service





