

Red Line Transformation Program Update, Friday, October 20

Work continues on the <u>Red Line Transformation</u> (RLT) program. As a reminder, the MBTA has implemented <u>a 16-day full-access closure</u> of the Mattapan Line and Ashmont Branch of the Red Line from **Saturday, October 14, through Sunday, October 29,** to expedite critical track work. RLT Improvements Continue Across the Red Line

- Codman Yard Expansion & Improvements <u>Codman Yard</u> upgrades will increase reliability, modernize existing infrastructure, and expand service capacity. This week, crews are stripping and backfilling newly installed duct banks and working on excavation for two utility vaults on Van Winkel Street. Next week, crews will continue to install duct banks and conduct borings for new utility bridge pilings. We continue to monitor pests in the area. - **Cabot Yard and Maintenance Facility** Upgrades to the <u>Cabot Yard and Maintenance Facility</u> will allow for safer and more efficient vehicle maintenance. This week, the project team is working on submittals and

deliverables to allow new duct bank installation to proceed. Next week, crews will receive materials necessary for duct bank installation to resume.

• Red Line Signal Upgrades

<u>Red Line Signal Upgrades</u> will result in improved service reliability, a renewed lifespan for the entire signals system, and more efficient communications about system diagnostics. Currently, crews are installing and testing new signal cables, maximizing the use of access granted by the surge. Next week, signal components and materials will be delivered, installed, and tested during the diversion on the Red Line.

• Expedited Track Work on Red Line Ashmont Branch and Mattapan Line On Saturday, October 14, the MBTA commenced full-access closures of the Red Line Ashmont Branch between JFK/UMass and Ashmont Stations, and on the Mattapan Line between Ashmont and Mattapan Stations. This full-access closure will continue through Sunday, October 29. During this closure, the MBTA will provide free, accessible shuttle bus service for riders on the Ashmont Branch and Mattapan Line. Riders can also take Fairmount Commuter Rail service for free during this diversion. This work is necessary for the MBTA to perform critical track work.
