# **OLT Improvements Continue Across the Orange Line**

### • Wellington Maintenance Facility

Modernizing the <u>Vehicle Maintenance Facility</u> will reduce downtime and customer wait times, provide cleaner trains, and deliver safer operations. Work crews will continue punch list work. The project team will be working on closeout documentation and commissioning as we near completion of the project. In the yard, crews began the realignment of the south ladder track, which will take two weeks to complete.

# • Orange Line Signal Upgrades

<u>Orange Line Signal upgrades</u> will result in improved service reliability, a renewed lifespan for the entire signal system, and more efficient communications about system diagnostics. This week, the fabrication schedule is being reviewed to ensure timely material delivery and component installation.

### • Orange Line Traction Power Substation Upgrades

Upgrades to <u>Traction Power Substations</u> will modernize the third rail power supply and reduce the risk of service disruptions, as well as develop a power system capable of supporting additional Orange Line service. At Oak Grove, Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) electricians are updating the SCADA network. Looking ahead, crews will continue performing network upgrades, installing power equipment and making electrical connections, and testing new equipment at multiple stations.
