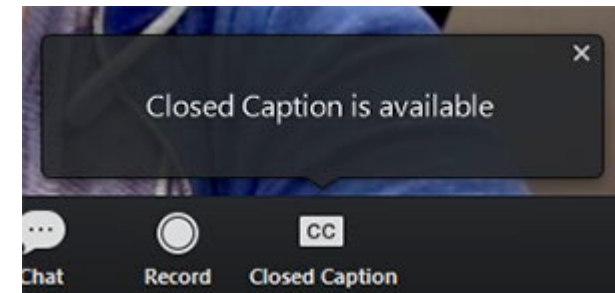

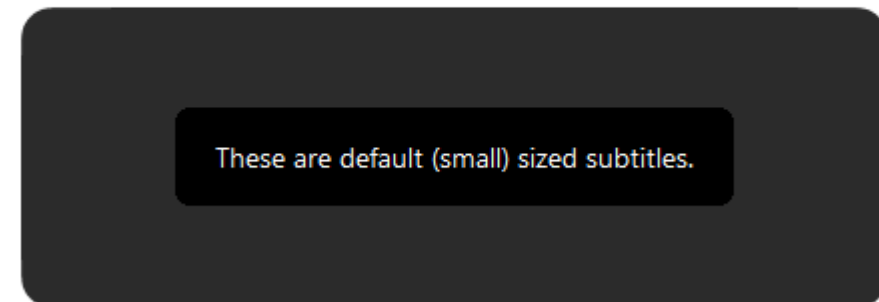
Closed Captions

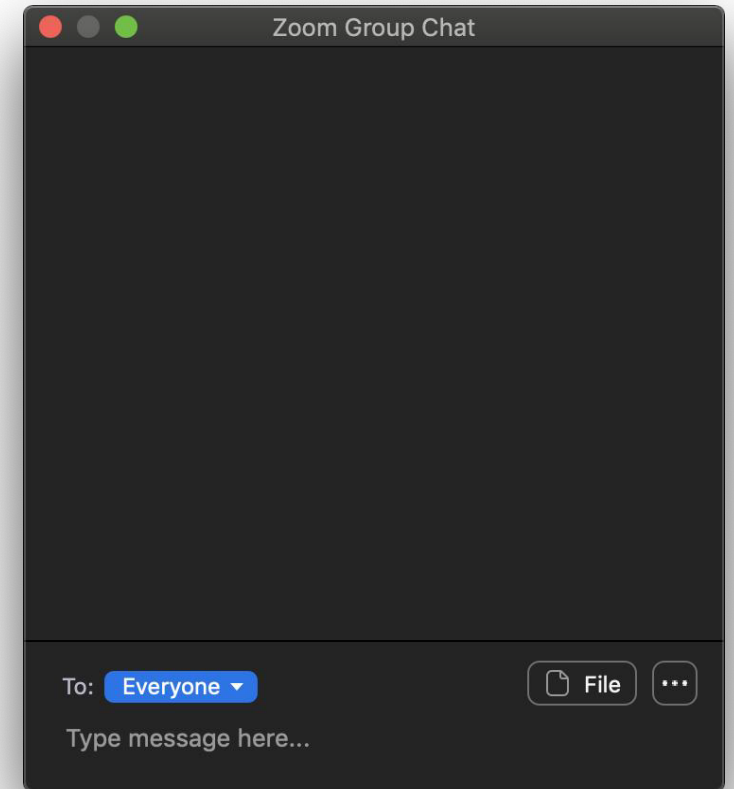

- Total Project Budget: \$25 Million
- Status: 100% Design

Project Benefits:

- New, fully accessible ferry dock
- Replacement and extension of the connecting walkway
- Replacement and extension of canopies
- Increased ferry slips and operational flexibility



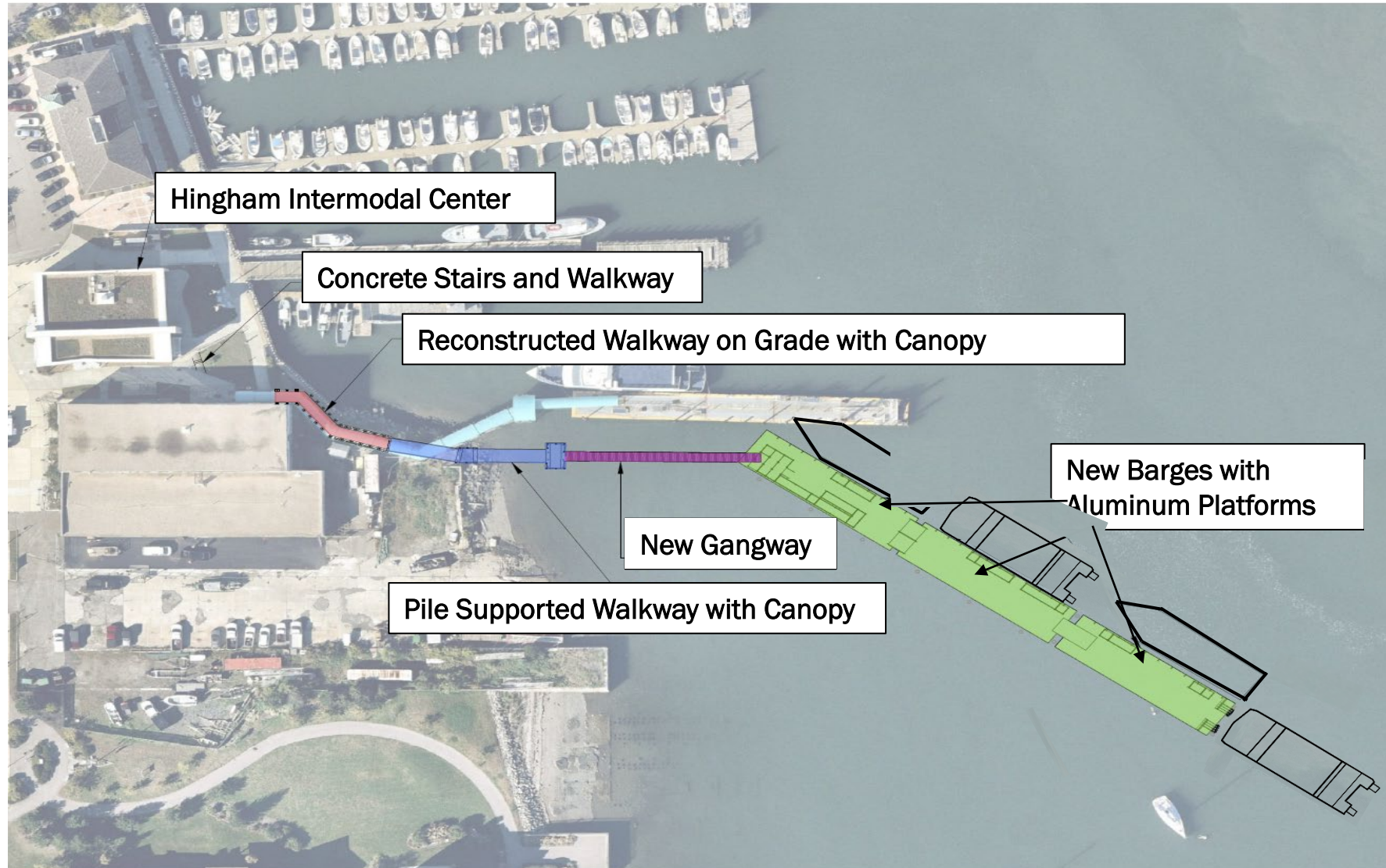
Existing Conditions: Walkway



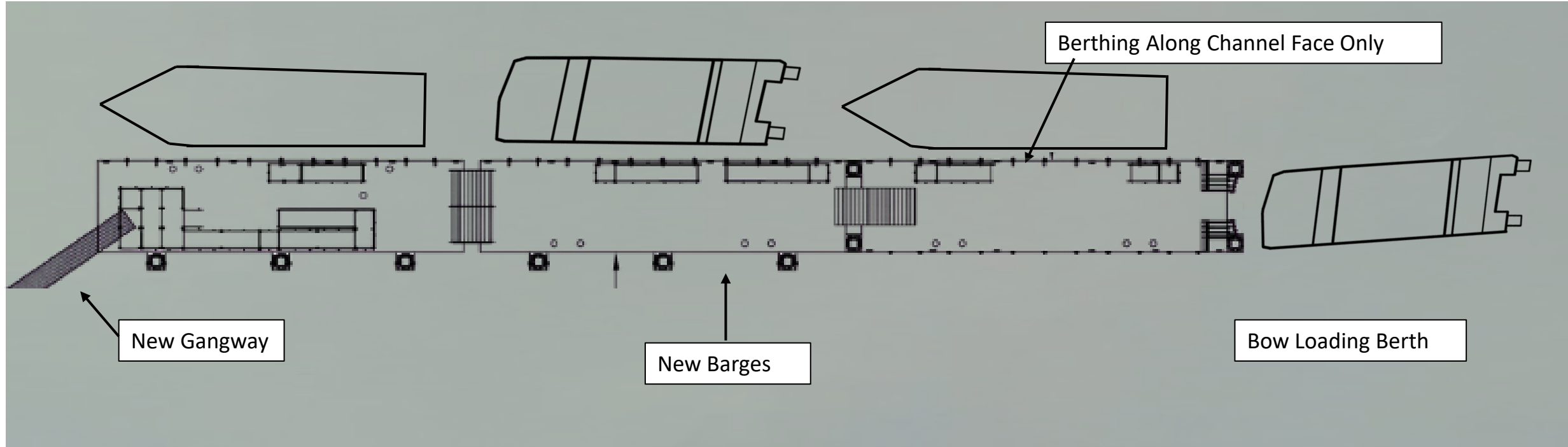
Existing Conditions: Ferry Dock and Gangway

- Coordinating with local utilities

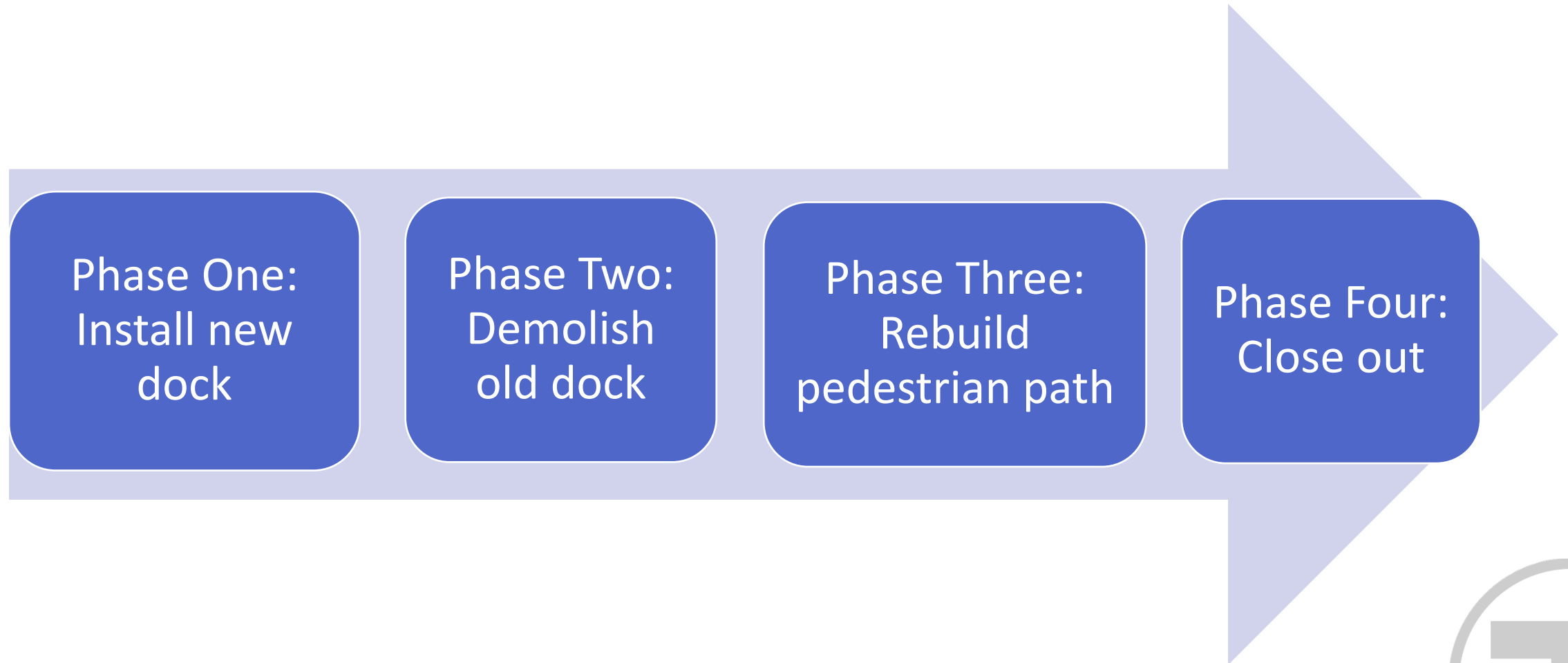


Anticipated Schedule

Proposed Construction Sequencing

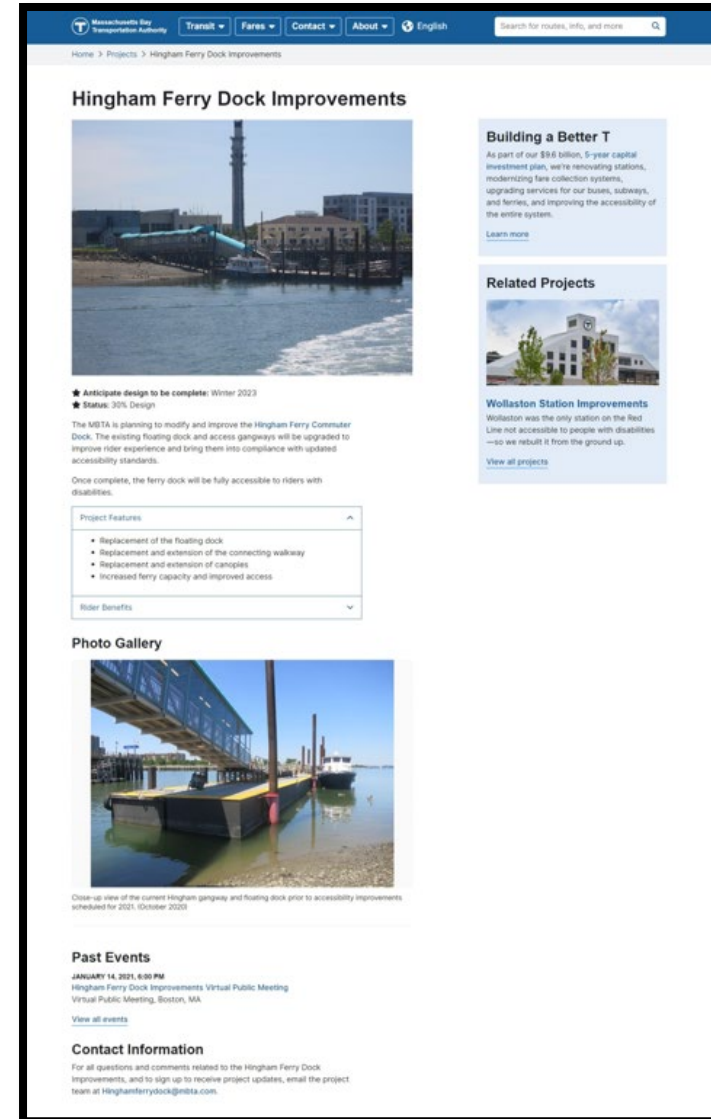


Construction is anticipated to take 18-24 months.

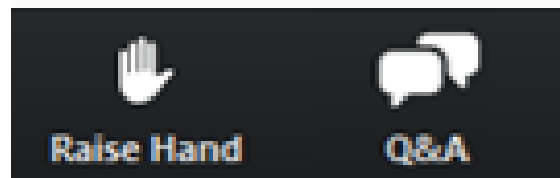
