
Overview of Work

Track Improvement Program

- MBTA has launched the Track
 Improvement Program, an initiative to eliminate all existing speed restrictions and bring tracks closer to a State of Good Repair by the end of this year.
- The MBTA will be rebuilding track infrastructure across the Red, Orange, Blue, and Green Lines over a series of surges.
- The Program will increase train speeds, reduce delays and disruptions, improve safety, and support reliable and consistent service.
- We will also use this opportunity to improve station areas, including lighting upgrades, deep cleaning, and infrastructure improvements.





Track Improvement Work Highlights

2023-2024 Work Accomplishments

- Since November 2023, safety related speed restrictions have been removed across the system, including:
 - 9 speed restrictions removed on the Red Line, between JFK/UMass and Park Street, November 2023
 - 22 speed restrictions lifted on the Green Line D Branch, between Riverside and Kenmore, December 2023.
 - 8 speed restrictions lifted on the Red Line, from Alewife to Harvard, February 2024.
 - 11 speed restrictions lifted on the Green Line, B, C, and D branches, February March 2024.
 - 7 speed restrictions lifted on the Orange Line, between North Station and Jackson Square, March 2024.
 - Additional speed restrictions have also been removed when Right of Way is available, such as on nights and weekends.
- Critical work has included: installation new rail, signal work, tunnel inspections and repairs, station inspections, repairs, and cleanings, and improvements to station security systems.
- This important work means that riders will experience a more reliable trip with fewer unplanned service disruptions, and a safer ride because of this state of good repair project.







Overview of Work – Blue Line Closures

Blue Line, April 9-11, April 17-19, April 20-28

- On the Blue line, we intend to remove a total of 18 speed restrictions.
- We will be replacing approximately 2000' of full depth construction, approximately 11,500 feet of rail, approximately 5,000 ties, and tamping and aligning about 41,000' of track.
- At the stations, maintenance and repairs will be performed such as paint, bench repairs, concrete repairs, floor repairs, stair tread replacement, handrail replacement, signage repairs, roof replacements, camera upgrades, plumbing & HVAC maintenance and inspection activities.






- The following Blue Line service impacts are planned for April 2024:
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Government Center and Orient Heights, April 9-11.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Maverick and Wonderland, April 17-19.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Airport and Wonderland, April 20-28.
- The MBTA will provide free, accessible shuttle bus service for riders during the surges. Transit Ambassadors and other MBTA personnel will be
 available to assist riders.
- Buses will operate on the below expected frequencies:
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Government Center and Orient Heights every 2-5 minutes.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Maverick and Wonderland every 1-5 minutes.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Airport and Wonderland every 1-5 minutes on weekdays, 3-5 minutes on Saturdays, and 4-5 minutes on Sundays.



Service Impacts – A Riders Guide to Planning Ahead

- The following Blue Line Service impacts are planned for April 2024:
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Government Center and Orient Heights, April 9-11.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Maverick and Wonderland, April 17-19.
 - Shuttle buses will replace service between Airport and Wonderland, April 20-28.
- Transit Ambassadors and other MBTA personnel will be available to assist riders throughout these closures. Riders should plan for extra travel time during these closures.






Program Benefits

2024 Track Improvement Program

- Riders can expect to see improvements to travel time and station areas after the work is complete.
- This program removes speed restrictions making for a safer and more reliable system.
- The MBTA will actively identify rider experience improvements through station enhancements, such as painting, power washing, and repairing lighting fixtures; vegetation removal; the removal of tripping hazards; and accessibility improvements.






What to Expect During Construction

2024 Track Improvement Program

- Crews will complete this important program by having multiple shifts, around the clock during each surge to accomplish work.
- The MBTA will mitigate noise levels wherever possible—including through noise-dampening blankets, low impact backup alarms, and noise monitoring. A hotline will be made for the public to report noise, and other constructionrelated issues will also be available.
- During individual surges, specific wayfinding signage, and additional transit ambassadors will be deployed to assist riders navigate the free alternative shuttle service.
