Mount Auburn Street – Cambridge-Watertown

- Key corridor for bus customers, in particular, Routes 71 and 73
- Pilot supports improved bus service for approximately 12,000 average daily bus customers
- MBTA buses along pilot corridor account for 3 percent of vehicles, carrying more than 50 percent of people during rush hour
- Successful implementation from partnership involving Watertown, Cambridge, DCR, Barr Foundation
